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
The Source of Data

- Conducted by the Census Bureau for the U.S.
 Department of Education
- 4 Cycles: 1987-1989, 1990-1992
 1993-1995, 1999-2001
- The largest source of information available on teachers:
 - -Sample: 55,000 teachers 12,000 schools


-Representing all 50 states


3 Induction Packages


<u>"Basic"</u>
-56% of beginners
-2 components: mentor and face-time with admin.


<u>"Basic & Collaboration"</u> -26% of beginners -4 components: mentor from own field; face-time with admin.; collaboration time; beginners' seminar


<u>"Basic & Collaboration & Teacher Network & Extra Resources"</u> -1% of beginners

-7 components: above 4 & external network; reduced courseload; teacher aide









Induction Components Most Effective in Reducing Turnover

- Mentor from the same field.
- Common planning time with teachers in the same subject or regularly scheduled collaboration with other teachers on instruction.
